

FREQUENT ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS) FOR TESTINGMOM.COM

1. What does your site offer that I can't get free on the Internet?

If your child will be tested for gifted and talented qualification, private school admissions or state assessments, we offer practice questions for the most common tests given for these purposes.

While you may be able to find small numbers of sample practice questions for certain tests on various sites on-line, our site offers **tens of thousands of practice questions** modeled after the actual tests that are most commonly given for gifted and talented qualification and private school admissions. We constantly add more questions to our site, so keep checking back for new practice questions even after you join. Our site also features hundreds of thousands of practice questions for the challenging Common Core State Standards that could determine if your child is able to advance to the next grade at the end of the current school year.

4. Are questions available as soon as I join?

Yes, questions are available immediately.

5. Can I download and print the questions?

Yes, you can! Or, you can open the questions on-line and go through them together, having your child point to the answers on the Internet. We suggest that you do some questions on-line with your child and print some questions so your child can do them with pencil and paper. Variety keeps it interesting for your child. 8. If I sign up at one level, but then want to upgrade, how do I do that?

9. How long should I practice questions with my child each day?

For younger children, you should start by practicing about 10 minutes a day and build up to a half an hour. When your child is close to the test date, you want to be sure he can focus on doing practice test questions (or another academic-like activity) for up to an hour because that is the typical length of a test. For older children in third grade and above, you can do practice questions together for up to a half hour each day.

10. What do you offer besides practice questions?

16. What if my child is being given a test that you don't offer practice questions for? Is it worth it to practice a different test from the one my child will be given?

If your child is being given a test that we don't list as having practice questions for, send a note to <u>help@testingmom.com</u> letting us know your child's age and current grade and what test he will be taking. There are hundreds of tests that schools choose from in assessing children and there is much overlap and similarity among many of the tests. If we don't have practice questions for the test your child will be taking, we can usually tell you what practice questions we do have that will help your child get ready for the test he will be taking. If we don't have the right practice questions to help your child get ready, we will tell you that as well.



17. How far in advance should I start doing practice questions with my child?

Ideally between 6 months and a year. By doing practice questions with their children, many parents discover that their child has a weakness in a particular area. Some kids struggle with math questions, others with visual-spatial questions. Some children don't listen to the question and ask for it to be repeated (and testers are usually not allowed to repeat questions). By starting well in advance, you have plenty of time to work with your child on any underlying ability that is giving him trouble. We can give you ideas on just what to do, depending on where your child is having a hard time. On the other hand, even if you have just two weeks before your child is being tested, you can still prepare. In that case, all you want to do is to give your child an idea of the kinds of questions that will be asked so she'll know what is expected of her when tested. Work with your child up to an hour a day, but no more.

18.I just found out my child is being tested next week and I only have a few days to prepare. Is it worth it to join?

It is always helpful for a child to have practiced the type of questions she will see when she is tested. We recommend that you sign up at <u>TestingMom.com</u> for one month and practice with your child the type of question she will be given when tested. Make sure that you cancel your membership when you are finished by following the cancellation procedure as described above.

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
